Dear Mr. Ramsay,

I was delighted to have your letter of February 16th about the Jackson material. We would be most interested in the negatives and the descriptive lists and would be glad to have a detailed list of these if it is available.

We shall also be most interested in the diaries and your father's Natural History books, diaries and correspondence, when you feel you are in a position to dispose of these.

I take it the Land Mollusca are natural history specimens suitable only for a Museum and in which we would not be interested. However, I would be glad of a more detailed description so that we might be able to advise you whether any Commonwealth Agency in Canberra, such as the C.S.I.R.O., would be interested; otherwise, and perhaps in any case, they might more appropriately be placed in a State Museum.
